Big Horn County Announces Seventh Death from COVID-19 Decedent was man in his 60's

HARDIN, MONTANA (July 30, 2020) – Big Horn County today confirmed a seventh death due to 2019 novel coronavirus (COVID-19) of an individual residing in the County. The decedent was a man in his 60's and was previously-confirmed positive. This is the second death in the last 24 hours in the County.

The Big Horn County COVID-19 Response Unified Coalition offers our deepest sympathies to his family and friends.

With the rise in confirmed positive cases and the recent deaths, it is ever more important that everyone take necessary precautions to stay safe and healthy. Big Horn County wants to remind all residents of the County to wear a mask and social distance when outside of their homes and in public. Masks are required when engaged in indoor activities, such as shopping. Masks are not necessary in the event that residents are outdoors and unlikely to come within six (6) feet of other people, such as while recreating or exercising alone.

Before going to your healthcare provider or emergency room, if you are experiencing any symptoms of COVID-19, please call ahead so that they can prepare for your arrival. If you are experiencing emergency warning signs, please call 9-1-1 and inform the dispatcher so that EMS/Ambulance can be prepared.
