## Big Horn County Announces Three (3) Newly-confirmed Cases of COVID-19 109 active cases in County, including 19 hospitalized

**HARDIN, MONTANA** (September 24, 2020) – Big Horn County added 12 new cases of COVID-19 on Thursday, September 24, 2020. Two (2) patients presented with symptoms and one (1) was asymptomatic (not showing symptoms) when tested. All three (3) patients were found through contact tracing of previously-reported patients.

The County asks all residents to please continue stay home more often and to avoid events or gatherings. Also, the Board of County Commissioners and Board of Public Health ask everyone to wear a mask and social distance when outside of their homes and in public.
