Big Horn County Reports 11 Newly-confirmed Cases of COVID-19

125 active cases in County, including eight (8) hospitalized

HARDIN, MONTANA (July 26, 2020) – Big Horn County added one (1) confirmed positive case of COVID-19 on Saturday and 10 on Sunday for a two-day total of 11. Community spread is likely in the case of one (1) patient and ten (10) patients were tested as a result of contact with previously-confirmed positive patients. Nine (9) were asymptomatic when tested and two (2) were symptomatic.

Recoveries in Big Horn County remained at 89. Five (5) persons are deceased. Of the 125 active cases, 117 patients are quarantining and recovering at home, and eight (8) patients are hospitalized.

Big Horn County wants to remind all residents of the County to wear a mask and social distance when outside of their homes and in public. Masks are required when engaged in indoor activities, such as shopping. Masks are not necessary in the event that residents are outdoors and unlikely to come within six (6) feet of other people, such as while taking advantage of our beautiful county, to work, recreate, or exercise.
