Big Horn County Reports Seven (7) Newly-confirmed Cases of COVID-19
69 recovered; 52 active cases, including four (4) hospitalized

HARDIN, MONTANA (July 13, 2020) – Big Horn County added seven (7) confirmed positive cases of COVID-19 on Monday. Six (6) were found through contact tracing and one (1) is likely community spread. All seven are symptomatic.

Recoveries in Big Horn County rose to a total of 69, with six (6) additional patients recovered. Five (5) persons are deceased. Of the 52 active cases, 48 patients are quarantining and recovering at home, and four (4) patients are hospitalized.

Big Horn County wants to remind all residents of the County to wear a mask and social distance when outside of their homes and in public. Masks are required when engaged in indoor activities, such as shopping. Masks are not necessary in the event that residents are outdoors and unlikely to come within six (6) feet of other people, such as while taking advantage of our beautiful county, to work, recreate, or exercise.
